Mboligihe Ndalu & his wife, Yoana, continue to minister in the very remote village of Dungu, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). Their mission is to improve the lives of their people spiritually, emotionally, & physically through a variety of ministries that God has laid on their hearts.

RTK Radio Ministry

Mboligihe is the **director of the RTK Radio ministry in Dungu**. The radio reaches the community with the Gospel message and with health and safety education. Tyndale Foundation has generously provided a grant to cover the installation costs of another RTK station in Banda, DRC, also under Mboligihe's directorship. Preliminary plans are underway to send a member of our U.S. team (& a former DRC missionary "kid"), Doug Jones, to Banda to set up the new radio station in early 2016.

Primary & Secondary Christian School

"Complexe Scolaire Pepiniere De Dieu" (CSPD), **the primary, secondary, & trade school**, is thriving & continues to grow. The present enrollment is over 900 students. Plans to build more classrooms & a multi-purpose building are "in the works". Through the ministry's scholarship program, several men & women have received (and are receiving) an education to return to Dungu as teachers at CSPD and as leaders in the diverse church departments. Anisungu, the Mboligihe's daughter, teaches there & is also the school accountant. Nathan, their middle son, is the Head Master of the school, & his new wife, Sifa, is a teacher. Amini, their youngest son, teaches Bible & English classes at the school. Scholarships are also made available to local students who show an aptitude for higher learning at the university level, but cannot afford financially. Many of the students who have received these scholarships have returned to the Dungu community upon completion of their study to contribute to the betterment of the community.



Trauma Healing Counseling

The Dungu area has experienced much hardship & trauma at the hands of the Lord's Resistance Army (LRA), a rebel group that ravages communities & kidnaps children to use as sex slaves & soldiers. The LRA has greatly decreased over the past couple of years, but the after-effects of such trauma on the community remains. So, Mboligihe **conducts ongoing trauma counseling training workshops** at area churches, and does many one-on-one counseling sessions with individuals needing spiritual & emotional care & healing, including area pastors seeking counsel & advice.

Mboligihe is on the managing committee for the **Dungu-May Health Center** which he helped build. Our U.S. team chairman, Bob Neyland, & a dental team from ITEC, an organization founded by Steve Saint, will be going to Dungu the end of November to train local medical people in general dentistry and dental hygiene. The team will bring with them portable dental chairs to leave there. Other dental equipment has been procured in nearby Uganda to enable the sustainability of an ongoing dental practice.

Woman's LIBAMA Ministry

LIBAMA is the women's ministry that Yoana initiated & oversees. This ministry's main goals are to teach women the Word of God, empower them to provide for their families, & to generate an income. Yoana has taught women the skills of soap making, baking, gardening, & raising livestock for their own use & to sell at a local market. The women are taught how to sew clothes & other items to sell in the market. Several women are taking literacy classes to learn to read & write in Lingala, the national language. And she leads (& trains other women to lead) weekly Bible Studies to encourage women to grow in their faith in God. A women's center is partially built where women will be able to gather for educational classes & fellowship when it is complete.
